



High School Broadcast Scholarship Program

The MAB Foundation has approved an ongoing scholarship for Michigan High School seniors. Students who have been accepted at a MABF-approved Michigan college, university or trade school and plan to pursue a career in a broadcast-related field may enter. **Each one-time scholarship award is \$750.**

Purpose:

The purpose of this scholarship is to support and encourage future broadcast professionals. This scholarship will promote both classroom study and professional internship experiences.

Applicant Eligibility:

Applicants for the MABF High School Broadcast Scholarship must be:

1. A Michigan High School senior with an accumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale;
2. A Michigan resident;
3. Accepted for enrollment in a two or four year Michigan college, university or trade school;
4. Planning to enroll in a full-time, undergraduate course of study in a broadcast-related field;
5. Currently working in a broadcast-related job or with some type of broadcast-related experience;
6. Exhibiting professional promise within the broadcast industry.

Application documentation shall include:

1. 200 word essay outlining career goals
2. Resume of candidate
3. High School transcript
4. Two Recommendation letters – one of which must come from a broadcast-related source
5. Completed Scholarship Application

Application Deadline:

All applications are due to the MAB Foundation office by **January 28, 2022**. Winners will be announced by mid-February 2022. Scholarship recipients will be recognized in-person at the Great Lakes Media Show on March 3, 2022 in Lansing, MI.

Selection Process:

The MAB Foundation Scholarship Committee will review each applicant and recommend a recipient to the MAB Foundation Board of Directors for final approval.

Scholarship Term:

The award will be presented at the Great Lakes Media Show annually. Funds will be sent directly to the school in the name of the student to be used in the fall semester of that same year. The funds are to be used for academic tuition and fees only. All funds are to be spent within one year of presentation.

MABF Scholarship Schools:

The MABF awards scholarships students attending Universities, Colleges, and Trade schools in Michigan that have approved broadcast-related programs. Schools receiving scholarships in the past include, but are not limited to: Adrian College, Central Michigan University, Delta College, Eastern Michigan University, Ferris State University, Grand Valley State University, Henry Ford College, Hope College, Lansing Community College, Michigan State University, Michigan Technical University, Northern Michigan University, Specs Howard School of Media Arts, Spring Arbor University, University of Michigan, Wayne State University, and Western Michigan University.
